

## NOVA SCOTIA REPORT

Nova Scotia Schoolreach enjoyed an extremely successful season with some of the most evenly contested competitions on record. Sixteen teams, in 4 divisions, played exhibition tournaments throughout the school year with various teams taking turns at the "top". The province welcomed two new teams on the South Shore (Western Division), one in Metro and, for the first time, Three Oaks Senior High School of Summerside, PEI (Northern Division). It is hoped that the success of the PEI entry may signal a resurgence of "Reach" on the Island.

## NEW BRUNSWICK REPORT

Fredericton High School was a repeat champion at the New Brunswick Reach For The Top final competition held at Oromocto High School on Saturday, May 1. F.H.S. defeated upstart Hampton High 435 to 420 in a close, exciting final.
In semifinal action, Fredericton bested James M. Hill 485 to 150 and Hampton got by Southern Victoria 345 -260. Other teams in the competition were Minto, Nackawic, Sir James Dunn, St. Stephen, Bathurst, Miramichi Valley, and Oromocto. Fredericton High also won the non-championship side of the tournament with the \# 2 team.
Most of Fredericton High's 1998 championship team were grade 11 students, so they had a second run at the Nationals. Team members for 1999 are Krista Byers-Heinlein, Alex Frank, Ben Goodyear, Rob Langmaid,
Janssen Kirby, and Martin Tingley. Cynthia Urquhart was serving her final year as F.H.S. coach/advisor as she will be moving to the new Fredericton North Leo Hayes High as vice-principal in the fall.
Also, the main quizmaster for the New Brunswick final tournament over the past number of years, Robert Kenyon, will be retiring from Oromocto High School this June. And Leo Boudreau, coach/advisor at Southern Victoria is also retiring. Thanks and good luck to both.
The New Brunswick teams were involved in five regional Reach tournaments over the past school year. These were at Fredericton High, Sir James Dunn, James M. Hill, Southern Victoria, and Oromocto High. The Fredericton, James M. Hill and Southern Victoria teams were the most successful at these competitions. Also, for the first time, two Nova Scotia teams joined us in the first tournament.

## Intermediate/Junior Division

This year saw an increase in the number of schools playing, primarily from the Maple Ridge area and another school in Richmond. Thanks go to Julie Lane from Maple Ridge Secondary who coordinated games, which included her school and that of Meadowridge, Pitt Meadows, with the addition of Hatzic next year. Sam Jessa coordinated the Richmond zone and welcomed McMath Secondary to the five schools already playing there. The provincial tournament was hosted by Maggie Pyrzborowska of Windermere Secondary in Vancouver, which brought together sixteen teams to compete in March. The eventual winner was last year's champion, St. George's. There were gold, silver and bronze medallions presented to the top three teams as well as the Intermediate Trophy, now in its fifth year.

## Senior Division

There was also an increase in participation in the senior zones, with new schools in the Maple Ridge area, another school in the Richmond zone, McMath Secondary and a rebirth of play on Vancouver Island, with the addition of Shawnigan Lake School. These entries brought the number of schools involved to twenty-one. The provincial tournament was also held at Windermere School over two days in late April. Thanks again to Maggie P for hosting the sixteen schools and the top three teams were St. George's, University Hill and Cambie Secondary. As was the case at the Intermediate or Junior tournament, medallions were awarded to the top three schools along with the Senior Schoolreach Trophy.
