

### NOVA SCOTIA REPORT



The 2005-2006 Reach for the Top season had an exciting beginning with an invitational tournament held in St. Andrews on November 19<sup>th</sup> with 24 teams competing in two divisions. Kennebecasis Valley High #1 beat Fredericton High #1 in the "A" final and Bernice MacNaughton beat FHS #2 in the "B" Final. The next invitational tournament was held at St. Malachy's High on December 10<sup>th</sup> with 24 teams competing. KVHS #1 defeated FHS #1 again in the "A" Final. The third invitational tournament was held at Kenebecasis High on Feb. 4<sup>th</sup> with 24 teams competing. Again KVHS beat FHS in the "A" Final. The Provincial Tournament was hosted by Fredericton High School on April 22<sup>nd</sup> with 10 teams competing in the Championship Section and 15 teams competing in the Non-Championship Section. # ONTARIO REPORT

The Ontario Provincial Championships were held in Scarborough, Ontario May 13-16. 38 league winners from across Ontario took part in a round robin tournament to determine the 10 teams that would advance to the TV round finals, held at Pope John Paul II School in Scarborough. The teams stayed at University of Toronto, Scarborough College in residences which houses with kitchen facilities, and walk out patios, providing for a really nice laid-back atmosphere.

After registration, teams gathered at Pope John Paul II school in the courtyard for roll call, discussion of rules and procedures, and schedules for team captains, and a lovely binder was presented to the teacher-coaches. The teams then played a practice game. This allowed everyone to become familiar with the process, and the layout of the school.

On Saturday evening teams attended an excellent banquet at Scarborough College, and Fraser Simpson, coach of the University of Toronto School team ran a true or false trivia contest which was lots of fun and had some very nice prizes contributed by our sponsors and several teams.

The actual 7 game tournament was played on Sunday. The top ten teams advanced to the TV round, and were determined first on games won, then on total points scored. This year there was a tie for the 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> position with each team winning the same number of games and scoring the same number of total points, so a sudden death playoff of snappers was held with the first winner of a snapper being declared the 6<sup>th</sup> place finisher.

On Monday and Tuesday, teams arrived at the TV studio (StudiOasis) for the tapings of the eleven game TV finals. Nicole Stamp was our outstanding quiz master again this year, and as usual did an excellent job of keeping the suspense going. There were several very close games with just 10 or 20 points between the winning and losing teams.

Overall, this was another excellent tournament. Many thanks to Teresa Chung, the coach of the John Paul II team and her team of volunteers for providing the facilities for playing the tournament and also a pizza lunch on Sunday.

Thanks also to Fraser Simpson for not only organizing the True or False game for the banquet on Saturday evening, but also for preparing a list of reading and judging hints for the teacher-coaches during the tournament.


# MANITOBA REPORT

This year saw another significant increase in the popularity of Schoolreach in the province. Forty-four schools subscribed giving representation to many new areas including Interior schools. Zones now include Vancouver, the North Shore, Richmond, Burnaby, Maple Ridge and Surrey. New schools in Kamloops, Clearwater, Logan Lake and Nakusp have opened up the interior region of the province and an increase is expected in participation on Vancouver Island.

The Intermediate tournament was held at St.John's School in Vancouver on March 31 and thirty schools were involved. St.George's, UBC Transition School and Winston Churchill School were the top three winners. A trophy and medals were awarded to these schools. Many thanks to the host coach Susan Liang and former Ontario coach Richard Mageau, now living in BC, for all of their work in organizing the biggest junior tournament to date.

On the senior level, a seeding tournament was held on April 7 in order to determine the top twenty-four schools out of thrity-six participants. Once again, this was the largest tournament of its kind and kudos to Donna Choo of Winston Churchill for organizing this event.

Those twenty-four schools top senior schools were taped by Knowledge Network over the last week of April in a new format that greatly enhanced the visual product. An upset took place when Windermere School of Vancouver beat six time champion St.George's in the final game. McRoberts Secondary, from Richmond, placed third and the two top teams will represent the province at the Nationals in Edmonton. Thanks are in order to Dan Moscrip of Knowledge Network for his ideas and production skills.

It has been a banner year for Reach in BC and my deep thanks are extended to all coaches and administrators for their support of the program. We look forward to more involvement next year as the network promotes the upcoming provincial and national televised series.
